
We at <u>EURAXESS</u>, are working every day to provide researchers from all over the world with the information, tools, skills and resources that support your long-term professional career goals.

Progression of EURAXESS services







Knowing your skills, strengths, values and motivations is of high importance when considering your future career options and reflecting on the various career paths you may choose, both within and outside academia.



Talent Development Suite




What does it offer?

Unlike other existing career support tools, the TDS does not evaluate researchers' skills and abilities but focuses on a researcher's vision. It is structured into four assessment sections: Future, Present, Past and Personal Journey Map.

To whom is it meant for?

PhDs and postdocs

- Achieve a better understanding of your professional and your private life.
- Find out what is your personal vision in defining and clarifying your professional future as well as your private aims.
- Figure out what steps you should take in order to achieve a successful career and a fulfilled private life.



Intercultural Assistant



What does it offer?

It aims at raising researchers' awareness of the complexity of the intercultural encounters they are likely to experience when on the move. It consists of four sections: What is Culture; Boost Your Intercultural Competence; Compare Cultures; Socializing.

To whom is it meant for?

Researchers

- Test and develop your intercultural communication skills and competences.
- Learn how to become a part of a new community.
- Get practical tips about how to find support while adapting to a new cultural environment.





No Limits Toolkit



What does it offer?

Provides researchers with an advice on how to explore their own needs by offering quizzes, links to resources, information and opportunities. It has four sections: Values and Motivations; Skills; Career Options; Plan Your Development.

- Consider a wide range of career options and plan to reach your professional goals.






REFLEX Online Application
